### Structure

8:45 – 9:00 AM: Introductions

The federal partners will be asked to briefly introduce themselves at the front of the room, sharing their name, title, the agency they work for, and how they and/or their department works with identity theft investigation and/or identity theft victim services. They will then disperse to one of 3-4 tables around the room for the guided round table networking.

9:00 – 10:00 AM: Guided Round Table Networking

A federal partner will be positioned at each table. Participants will move to a new table every 15 minutes so everyone has a chance to meet the partners and ask questions or engage in discussion. Priority is given to participants to ask any questions they may have. However, if no participants have questions, we have provided a few prompts below for the federal partners to consider. Federal partners are also welcome to ask questions of the participants, which will include advocates, local law enforcement, attorneys, consumer protection company representatives, and others.

### Questions

These questions are designed as prompts to federal partners in case nobody at the table has any direct questions or topics of conversation they would like to address.

- What sorts of identity theft (including identity theft using cybercrime) cases does your agency work with? Can you provide an example that demonstrates how your agency responds to these particular kinds of cases?
- How does your agency interact with victims? What victim services are available, and how do you partner with outside organizations to provide supportive services?
- If you could tell the general public anything about your agency and the work you do, particularly victims of crime or the professionals who serve them, what would it be?
- Under what circumstances would someone contact your agency directly? How would they reach you?
